

The Virginia Dominion Energy Envirothon is a natural resources competition through which high school students around the Commonwealth compete by demonstrating their knowledge of environmental science and natural resource management. Students work to solve real-world environmental problems and demonstrate their knowledge of aquatics, forestry, soils, wildlife, and a **current issue topic.** Students work in teams of five and work with a coach throughout the school year to prepare to compete at their area level, where they are able to progress to the state and international level competition. Teams compete in written tests as well as an oral presentation, where they respond to a current issue scenario and present real-world solutions as a team to a panel of judges.

#### **2022-2023 Program Highlights**

Students and coaches from across the state participated in hands-on, outdoor learning experiences thanks to the help of local SWCDS and partner agencies.

**40 teams** competed at the regional level and **17 teams** competed at the state level. The Virginia Dominion Energy Envirothon State Competition took place May 21-22nd at Virginia State University in Petersburg, VA.
